360° Installation

This projector supports 360° free orientation operation.

- The projector must be installed in a location that is sturdy enough to support the full weight of the projector and brackets. (The weight of GP01 is approximately 0.20kg).
- Ensure that the projector is tightly secured to the brackets.




Attaching a Wrist Strap


When projecting by hand, hang the projector around your wrist with a wrist strap.

A wrist strap is effective in preventing projector dropping and avoiding possible damage to the product.


Connecting the Projector

Charging the Projector



Fully charge the projector before using it for the first time.

- Ensure that the power adapter is firmly connected to the wall outlet.
- Ensure that the USB cable is firmly connected to the power adapter and to the DC IN port on the projector.
- Connect the power adapter to the wall outlet that is the closest to the projector.
- (*) The power adapter is an optional item and not supplied. Please use an adapter that has an output of 5V/2A or higher.




- * During projector's built-in battery charging, the LED indicator is flashing red.
- When the battery charging is complete, the LED indicator turns off.
- When the battery charging is complete, please unplug the AC adapter from the wall outlet.

Connect to Video/PC/iOS/Android



- Due to the difference in applications for each country, some regions may have different accessories.
- To ensure the projector works well with your computer, please make sure the timing of the display mode is compatible with your projector. Please see page 47.
- Use the cables that come with the projector.



Powering On/Off the Projector

Powering On the Projector and Connecting to the HDMI Source

- 1. Ensure that the HDMI cable is firmly connected. If using an external power supply, ensure that the USB-C cable is securely connected to the power adapter and power adapter is connected to the wall outlet.
- Turn on the projector by pressing and holding the "Power" key for 1 second or longer. •
 The power LED around the "Power" key will turn blue and the RICOH logo will be displayed on the screen for 20 seconds. After that is displayed a blank screen.
- 3. Turn on the HDMI source, for example Video Player.
- 4. Press the "Display/Enter" key to start the projection. By default, the screen is displayed while pressing the "Display/Enter" key.
- 5. If the projector cannot detect the source, it will display the source icon on the screen. Press the "Input" key to change the signal source or confirm the source.
- 6. Turn the focus ring to adjust the focus manually.



CAUTION:

- Do not look into the lens while the projector is on. The strong light from the light source may cause damage to your eyesight.
- Do not block the light from projection lens by anything when you want to stop projection. Doing so could cause a fire due to heating by strong light. Please use "Keep Projection" function for this purpose.



*If you turn on the projector for the first time, the system will display a language selection menu.



Select your preferred language and press the "Display/Enter" key on the control panel to confirm.

- *To display the Input Source menu, press the "Power" key for 0.5 seconds or longer.
- Turn on the projector first and then the signal source.

- *Press the "Input" key for 0.5 seconds or longer to display the Input Source menu.
- *To learn how to use your iOS device, please refer to the operating instructions that came with the device.

Powering On the Projector and Connecting to the iOS Device (Direct Connection)

1. Turn on the projector by pressing and holding the "Power" key for 1 second or longer.

The power LED around the "Power" key will turn blue and the RICOH logo will be displayed on the screen for 20 seconds. After that is displayed a blank screen.


2. Press the "Input" key for 0.5 seconds or longer to display the Input Source menu. Press the ▲/▼ keys to change the input source to iOS. Then press the "Display/Enter" key.

3. Press the "Display/Enter" key again to display the screen. If the connection to the iOS device has not been established, the Device Name and Password message will appear on the top left corner of the screen. (Figure 1)

4. Configure WiFi settings on the iOS device. Open the "Settings" > "WiFi" menu. Enable "WiFi". Select the Device name that is displayed on the screen, and enter the password to establish the WiFi connection. (Figures 2~4)

5. Swipe up from the bottom of the iOS screen to open the Control Center. Tap on "Screen Mirroring". (Figure 5)

6. Tap on the connected ImagePointer to start the screen mirroring. (Figure 6)



Powering On the Projector and Connecting to the iOS Device (Connection via Router)

- 1. Turn on the projector by pressing and holding the "Power" key for 1 second or longer.
 - The power LED around the "Power" key will turn blue and the RICOH logo will be displayed on the screen for 20 seconds. After that is displayed a blank screen.
- Press the "Input" key for 0.5 seconds or longer to display the Input Source menu. Press the ▲/▼ keys to change the input source to iOS. Then press the "Display/Enter" key.
- 3. Configure the router connection settings in the "Setup" > "Wifi Setting" > "Internet" menu. Configure the connection settings to the router also on your iOS device.
- 4. Press the "Display/Enter" key to display the screen. If the connection to the iOS device has not been established, the Device Name and Password message will appear on the top left corner of the screen.
- 5. Swipe up from the bottom of the iOS screen to open the Control Center. Tap on "Screen Mirroring".
- 6. Tap on the connected ImagePointer to start the screen mirroring.


- *Press the "Input" key for 0.5 seconds or longer to display the Input Source menu.
- *To learn how to use your iOS device, please refer to the operating instructions that came with the device.

Powering On the Projector and Connecting to the Android Device (Direct Connection)

1. Turn on the projector by pressing and holding the "Power" key for 1 second or longer. The power LED around the "Power" key will turn blue

and the RICOH logo will be displayed on the screen for 20 seconds. After that is displayed a blank screen.

- 2. Press the "Input" key for 0.5 seconds or longer to display the Input Source menu. Press the **△**/**▼** keys to change the input source to Android. Then press the "Display/Enter"
- 3. Press the "Display/Enter" key again to display the screen. If the connection to the Android device has not been established, the Device Name and Password message will appear on the top left corner of the screen. (Figure $\overline{7}$)
- 4. Swipe down from the top of the Android device screen to open the quick settings panel. Tap "Smart View". Select the Device name that is displayed on the screen, and tap "Start now". (Figures 8~10)
- 5. When the connection status appears (Figure 11), then the





- ❖Press the "Input" key for 0.5 seconds or longer to display the Input Source menu.
- The instructions described in this section may vary depending on the Android version. To learn how to use your Android device, please refer to the operating instructions that came with the device.
- Before using the screen mirroring, ensure that your Android device supports Miracast. Without Miracast support, the screen mirroring is not possible.

Powering Off the Projector

1. Press and hold the "Power" key for 2 seconds to turn off the projector. You will see a message as below on the screen.



If you wish to turn the projector back on, you must wait until the projector has entered the standby mode. When it is in standby mode, simply press "Power" to restart the projector.

2. Disconnect the USB-C cable from the projector.

Warning Indicator

When the LED indicator flashes red and blue (0.1 sec on / 0.1 sec off / 0.1 sec on / 0.1 sec off / 0.1 sec on / 0.5 sec off) and the message below displays onscreen, it indicates the projector has overheated. Ensure that the ambient temperature is within operating range. If the problem persists, please contact the vendor.



When the LED indicator flashes red and blue (0.1 sec on / 0.1 sec off / 0.1 sec on / 0.1 sec off / 0.1 sec on / 0.1 sec off / 0.1 sec on / 0.3 sec off) and the message below displays onscreen, it indicates an internal error has occurred. Restart the projector. If the problem persists, please contact the vendor.



When you press the "Power" key for 2 seconds or more, the following error is displayed on the screen.




- When the Power LED lights red for 10 seconds, the power is turned off. To turn on the projector, wait until the Power LED turns off. Then press the "Power" key again.
- Disconnect the USB type-C cable from the projector and from the power adapter.

Adjusting the Projector Focus


To adjust the focus, turn the focus ring clockwise or counterclockwise until the image is sharp and legible.

The projector will focus at distances from 1.96 to 6.43 feet (0.6 to 1.96 m).

On Screen Display (OSD)


The Projector has a multilingual On Screen Display that allows you to make image adjustments and change a variety of settings.

How to operate

- 1. To open the OSD, press the "Menu" key for 0.5 seconds or longer.
- 2. To select an item, press the \triangle or ∇ keys and then press \longleftarrow .
- 3. To adjust settings, press the \triangle / ∇ or \triangleright / \triangleleft keys.
- 4. Press the "Menu" key once to return to the previous menu or press the "Menu" key repeatedly to exit the OSD menu.



The projector has a multi-language onscreen display (OSD) menu that can be displayed with or without an input source.

Main Menu

Input Source

Set the input source.

▶ HDMI: Set HDMI as input source.



Android: Connect to your Android device via WiFi.



▶ iOS: Connect to your iOS device via WiFi.



Volume

Adjust the volume.



- ▶ Press the ▲ key to turn up the volume (up to 10).
- ▶ Press the **▼** key to turn down the volume (minimum value 0).

<u>Keystone</u>

Manually adjust image distortion caused by tilting the projector.

<u>Image</u>

Go to "Image" sub menu.

<u>Display</u>

Go to "Display" sub menu.

Go to "Setup" sub menu.




Image Menu

Picture Mode

There are factory presets optimized for various types of images.

- Standard: Mode for optimizing the balance between brightness and color reproduction. Suitable for PC screen display and presentation.
- Photo/Movie: This mode brings the color reproduction space closer to sRGB. You can project photos and movies in colors close to their original colors.
- Vivid: Mode for emphasizing color.

Brightness

Adjust the brightness of the image.

- ightharpoonup Press the ightharpoonup to increase the brightness of the screen (up to 50).
- Press the ▼ to reduce the brightness of the screen (minimum value 0).

Contrast

Adjust the contrast.

- Press the ▲ to increase the contrast of the screen (up to 50).
- ▶ Press the \blacktriangledown to decrease the contrast of the screen (until 0).

Aspect Ratio

Use this function to choose your desired aspect ratio.

- ▶ Auto: The projector displays the image by automatically switching the screen sizes between 4:3 and 16:9.
- ▶ 4:3: Input signal is displayed with 4:3 aspect in the center of the screen.
- ▶ 16:9: Input signal is displayed with 16:9 aspect in the center of the screen. This mode is for 16:9 aspect signals.
- ▶ 16:10: This format is for 16:10 input sources, like wide screen laptop.

Color Temperature

Select the color temperature.

- ▶ Cold: The screen image looks colder.
- ▶ Medium: The medium color temperature.
- Warm: The screen image looks warmer.

Color Space

Select an appropriate color matrix type from "Auto", "RGB", and "YCbCr".

Note

*The "Color Space" function is supported only in HDMI mode.




Display

Projection

Select the projection mode, depending upon how the projector is mounted. The options include "Normal", "H Flip", "V Flip", and "HV Flip".

Keep Projection

Select how the "Display/Enter" ← key should be pressed to keep continuous projection. The options include "While pressing", "1 click", "Double click", "5sec Later", and "All times".



Setup

Language

The language used in the onscreen Menu is available in English, Germany, French, Italian, Spanish, Portuguese, Polish, Dutch, Russian, Swedish, Traditional Chinese, Simplified Chinese, Japanese, Turkish, Thai, Arabic, and Danish.

Sleep Timer

Set the countdown timer interval between "5", "10", "15", or "Off". The countdown timer will start, without signal being sent to the projector and without OSD operation. The projector will automatically power off when the countdown has finished.

WiFi Setting

Go to "WiFi Setting" sub menu.

User Logo

Set the background image that is displayed on the screen when there is no input signal. In the list of background images, press the ◀ and ▶ keys to select your preferred image. Then press the "Display/Enter" key. The selected background image is displayed on the screen until the projector detects the signal input. To save a background image, go to page 37.

Software Upgrade

Search for software upgrade online. Wait until the upgrade process is complete.



Software Ver.

View the current projector's firmware version.



Reset

Return all data to the factory defaults. After choosing this option, a confirmation message appears on the screen. Select "Yes" to confirm or "No" to cancel reset.





*Before upgrading the software, ensure that the projector has access to the Internet and the internal battery is fully charged. If not fully charged, the upgrade process stops and the projector displays the following message on the screen:

*To start wireless screen casting, connect your portable device and the projector to the same wireless access point.



To connect the projector to the WiFi, do the following:

- 1. Open "Menu" > "Setup" > "WiFi Setting" and press "Display/ Enter" ← on the control panel.
- 2. Select the "Internet" 🚏 tab.
- 3. Do either of the following:
 - Select your preferred wireless access point from the list to make the connection. If the WiFi is password-protected, enter the password at the prompt. Then press the "Menu" key to close the onscreen keyboard, and press "OK".





 If the wireless access point is not available, connect your portable device directly to the projector's hotspot. The WiFi name (Device Name) and the password (Password) are displayed on the Internet tab.



*The default device name is "IMPXXXXX" where the "XXXXX" are the five last numbers of the product Serial Number. For example, "IMP00099".

To set an access password for the projector, do the following:

- 1. Open "Menu" > "Setup" > "WiFi Setting" and press "Display/Enter" ← on the control panel.
- 2. Select the "Password" at tab.
- 3. Use the onscreen keyboard to enter a password that contains numbers and/or letters up to 8 symbols. When the password is set, click \(\psi\).

Device Name



*The default device name is "IMPXXXXX" where the "XXXXX" are the five last numbers of the product Serial Number. For example, "IMP00099".



To change the default projector name, do the following:

- 1. Open "Menu" > "Setup" > "WiFi Setting" and press "Display/ Enter" ← on the control panel.
- 2. Select the "Device Name" tab.
- 3. Use the onscreen keyboard to enter a new name. The name can contain numbers and/or letters up to 10 symbols. When the name is changed, click ←.



* After resetting the system (Setup > Reset), the device name and password are also reset to the default values.

5GHz



Enable or disable 5GHz communication. By default, 5GHz is off (5GHz radio waves are disabled). If 5GHz is available in your area, and you want to enable this function, do the following:

- Open "Menu" > "Setup" > "WiFi Setting" and press "Display/ Enter" ← on the control panel.
- 2. Select the "5GHz" * tab.
- 3. Press the to enable 5GHz bandwidth.



User Logo Setting

You can add/display a background image on the screen if there is no input signal. The User Logo image must be in Jpeg format. If you want to display the image in a full screen, make sure the image size is 864x480 pixels. To download an image, connect the projector directly to the PC or any other compatible device. When connecting directly, set the input source to "HDMI" or "iOS".


Download images from a Windows PC:

- 1. Connect the projector to the Windows PC via WiFi.
- 2. Open the File Explorer and type "ftp://192.168.168.1" to the address bar. When prompted, enter the User Name and Password as they appear in the User Logo menu.
- 3. Click "Log On" and access the User Logo folder. (Figures 1~3)





- *To set the User Logo, go to page 32.
- Only images in Jpeg format can be used as logos.
- *The maximum image size for baseline Jpeg is 8000 x 6000 pixels and for progressive Jpeg is 1600 x 1200 pixels.
- *Up to 11MB of User Logo images are allowed to upload.
- *The image file name cannot contain the following characters: \/:?*"'<>|.



- 3. Copy and paste the image to the User Logo folder. The image appears in the User Logo menu. The Available Size will decrease after the image is uploaded. (Figures 4~5)
- 4. When the upload is complete, close the WiFi connection between the projector and the Windows PC.





Download images from an iOS device:


- 1. Connect the projector to the iOS device via WiFi.
- 2. Start the File Transfer Protocol (FTP) app on your iOS device, for example "iFTP Pro".
- 3. Open the iFTP Pro app, tap "+" to add a new FTP site. Enter the Hostname "192.168.168.1", Username and Password as displayed in the User Logo menu, Port: "21", Protocol: "FTP". Tap "Save" to save the new FTP site. (Figures 6~8)
- 4. Tap on the new FTP site and access the User Logo folder. (Figure 9).
- 5. Your images from the iOS device are displayed on the bottom of the screen in Photo Library folder. Select the images you want to upload to the projector. When done, tap "Done". (Figures 10~11)
- 6. When the upload is complete, close the WiFi connection between the projector and your iOS device.



Download an image from an Android device:

- Connect the projector to the Android device via WiFi. On the Android device, select "Settings" > "WiFi". Then tap on the projector name and enter the password.
- 2. Start the file manager app on your Android device, for example "File Manager".
- 3. Open the File Manager app and tap on "Remote". (Figure 12).
- 4. Tap on "Add a remote location". (Figure 13)
- 5. Tap on "FTP". (Figure 14).
- 6. Enter the Hostname: "192.168.168.1", Port: "21", Username and Password as displayed in the User Logo menu. Then tap "OK".(Figures 15)
- 7. On the home page of the File Manager, ensure that under "Remote" tab is "(1)", indicating that adding a new FTP site was successful. (Figure 16)
- 8. Select the images you want to upload to the projector from any folder (usually "Images" folder). (Figure 17)
- 9. Long press on the image you want to transfer. A menu appears on the bottom of the screen. Tap on "Copy". (Figure 18)
- 10. Return to the Home page of the File Manager and tap on "Remote" to enter the FTP site. Then tap on "Paste" at the bottom of the screen. (Figure 19)
- 11. The image transfer starts. (Figure 20)
- 12. When the upload is complete, close the WiFi connection between the projector and your Android device.

Troubleshooting

If you experience trouble with the projector, refer to the following information. If the problem persists, please contact your local dealer or service center.

Problem: No image appears on screen

- Ensure that the power connection is correctly and securely connected as described in the "Connecting the Projector" section.
- ▶ Ensure that the terminals are not crooked or broken.
- Ensure that the power of the connected device is turned on.
- Ensure that the projector is in the projection mode. Press the "Display/Enter" key and check if the image appears on the screen.
- Ensure that the connected device is not in the standby mode.

Problem: Partial, scrolling or incorrectly displayed image

- If you are using a Notebook:
 - 1. First, follow the steps above to adjust resolution of the computer.
 - Press the toggle output settings.
 For example in Windows system, press "Windows key" + "P".
- ▶ If you experience difficulty changing resolutions or your monitor freezes, restart all equipment including the projector.

Problem: The screen of the Notebook or PowerBook computer is not displaying a presentation

Some Notebook PCs may deactivate their own screens when a second display device is in use. Each has a different way to be reactivated. Refer to your computer's documentation for detailed information.

Problem: Image is unstable or flickering

- ▶ Change the monitor setting from your computer.
- Check and reconfigure the display mode of your graphic card to make it compatible with the product.

Problem: Image is out of focus

- Adjust the Focus Ring on the projector.
- Make sure the projection screen is between the required distance. Please see page 23.

Problem: The image is stretched when displaying 16:9 DVD

Change "Aspect Ratio" by pressing the "Menu" key on the control panel and change the image format in "Menu" > "Image" > "Aspect Ratio".

Problem: Image is too small or too large

- Move the projector closer to or further from the screen.
- Press "Menu" key on the control panel and then go to "Menu" > "Image" > "Aspect Ratio" and try the different settings.

Problem: Image is reversed

Press "Menu" key on the control panel and then go to "Menu" > "Display" > "Projection" and adjust the projection direction.

Problem: Projector turned off with power adapter

- ▶ Ensure the power adapter output is 5V/2A or higher.
- Ensure the environmental temperature is in the range of 32° to 86°F (0° to 30°C).

Problem: Message Reminders

▶ Over temperature (flashing purple, lights up 3 times per second)

▶ Internal error - restart the projector. If the problem persists, please take the projector to the service.



▶ Battery error - Please take the projector to the service.



- Projector is unresponsive:
 - The internal battery may be depleted. Plug in the power adapter and make sure the LED indicator starts flashing red.



To remove the internal battery, you need the following tools:


- Precision screwdriver set

To remove the battery, do the following:


- Discharge the battery. To discharge, turn on the projector and leave it idle until the battery depletes and the power turns off. Wait until the projector cools down sufficiently.
- 2. Separate the top and bottom covers of the projector.
 - a) Using a precision screwdriver, remove the two screws from the bottom cover.




b) Pry open the upper and bottom covers near the lens. Using a flat-head screwdriver, work around the edges of the bottom and top cover to undo the plastic clips.



- 3. Remove the bottom cover.
 - a) While holding the top cover, remove the bottom cover from the device.




4. Remove the battery. The battery is installed on the bottom side of the projector. Disconnect the battery cable and then remove the battery.




Cabinet Dimensions
